In accordance with our talk over the 'phone this morning would suggest you try and purchase two or three million more Hemlock and have same shipped so we will get 6 cars per day out of Ironwood steadily and deck what surplus you can to draw on next spring and summer. Figure this Hemlock as follows:

Am sure we can sell these logs to paper mill at any time later on and make a profit even after the cost of decking is figured in. Figured over-run 15% to be safe and which should be low. Do not think we should figure logs in deck to cost over about 17.00 to 17.50.
