

1/14 - Carl Klemen, former bookkeeper for the U.S. Leather Co. at Rib Lake, died last week in Wausau.

The log harvest for this year will soon be over and although the total number of board feet received at the local lands this year is far short of former seasons, it is enough to show that we are still a timber producing section. J. H. Slaus, who has the contract for loading and docking practically all the logs delivered to the several landings, reports that the total for this season is approximately three million feet of hardwood logs. This represents a log value of around \$66,000 which is quite an item to the farmers in this town.

He will tear down his old camps east of Goodrich, and move them to the new location where he will log four square miles of timber for the Rib Lake Lumber Co.

## Runaway Injury Fatal to Gordon

Claude Gordon of Rib Lake died at the hospital Sunday as the result of a runaway accident. The accident occurred at Rib Lake last week Wednesday. His right leg was broken, his shoulder was hurt, and he suffered a concussion of the brain from an injury over his left eye. He never regained consciousness.

He was driving a Lamberty team, said to be a rather gentle pair, and it is not known what caused them to run away. He was in the Rib Lake Lumber Company's mill yard, with the team hitched to a mill woodcart. The team ran out of the mill yard and turned the corner on the tracks to go north on McComb Avenue. Gordon was thrown out at the turn.

He was picked up, almost dead and given medical attention by Dr. Baker. He was brought to the Medford hospital next day by his brother Joe and Dr. Baker, and efforts were made to save his life, but without avail.

Claude was a single man, thirty-three years old. He leaves his mother, three brothers, and two sisters.
