1/21 - **Coroner Probes Sudden Death**

Coroner T. C. Hartwig was called to Rib Lake Tuesday night to investigate the sudden death of Frank Miller, a horse barn employe of the Rib Lake Lumber Co. Coroner Hartwig was accompanied by Sheriff Fred Linther and Deputy Sheriff Charles Stellick. They returned to Rib Lake yesterday for further investigation, accompanied by Dist. Atty. T. W. Andresen.

Miller died under a stairway between the pool hall of Art Swanson and the Arnold hardware store. According to Jerry Kapitz and Art Swanson, they saw him fall on the walk and dragged him into the space between the two buildings, about 6:00 o'clock in the evening.

They called Dr. Baker and Marshal Curran. Dr. Baker was in the country but Dr. Lapham's wife with a stethoscope and pronounced the man dead a few minutes after he had been pulled under the stairway. Marshal Curran and Dr. Baker returned later.

Miller had a large bruise over his eye. People state that they had seen him drunk, but that he had been drinking Tuesday noon. He had been working on a lumber company job; he left his team with John Miller at 5:15, saying that he didn't feel well and that he would go up to the pool hall and take a drink. One man stated that Miller had fallen against a wall at noon.

Miller's body was taken to the undertaker's parlor by Art Taylor and returned there by Coroner Hartwig and Dr. Baker.

Rib Lake Man Dies Here.
 John Anderson died Monday, October 18, at the Medford Clinic. The cause of his death was an abscess of the liver. He was 44 years of age. His body was shipped to Almena, Wisconsin, to be buried in Clayton, Wisconsin, yesterday, October 20. Mr. Anderson was a woodsman in the employ of the lumber company at Rib Lake.
