Rib Lake Saw Mill Is Running Again After Two Weeks' Repairs

The Rib Lake Lumber Company resumed sawing last week, after a two weeks' shutdown for repairs. The men are sawing hemlock and they have enough logs in the lake to keep them sawing until well into the winter, when the other timber will be coming, says the Rib Lake Herald.

The company's planing mill has been running day and night for some time to keep up with the orders for dressed and matched lumber. The mill has been shipping about ten car loads a day and it is expected this will be increased.

Rib Lake Company Cuts Much Lumber

The Rib Lake Lumber Company is cutting more lumber than ever before, says the Herald. The mill will run steadily all winter. There is hemlock on hand to last until January 1st, when the start will be made on hardwood.

The company operates two camps and has contracts with eighteen jobbers, of whom Jim Peterson and L. P. Lamberty are the biggest operators. The hardwood cut will be smaller than usual this winter, but the Rib Lake company expects to cut enough hardwood and hemlock to keep the mill running steadily until a year from December 1st.

The lumber company is shipping bark from the woods, but it is not certain whether bark will be peeled next summer. Some men believe the price of bark will advance enough to warrant further peeling.
