

4/18- Rib Lake Lumber Company to Lay 14 Miles of Track: The Rib Lake Lumber Company this summer will lay 14 miles of steel rails to its timber stand in Lincoln County, where the Company owns about 10 square miles of virgin timber, and also will grade and gravel several miles of road bed, at an approximate cost of \$50,000, officials announced last week.

This season's cut has been completed and the mill's supply of timber will last until August, logging operations will be resumed about July 1st. It is estimated that about 470 men were employed at the company's and jobber's camps this past season.

10/3- Rib Lake Mill Begins Operations on Tuesday: The Rib Lake Lumber Co. sawmill began operations Tuesday after a shutdown of a month for annual repairs. During the shutdown a number of men at the plant were employed repairing the mill and tramways to have the mill in first class shape for the coming winter's operation.

The logging camps have been operating for some time and it is believed that enough logs are on hand to keep the mill operating steadily.

10/17- Change in Freight Train Service to Rib Lake: The local freight that runs on the Soo Line between Abbotsford and Park falls now goes into Rib Lake every Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday morning. The train that formerly ran from Rib Lake to Abbotsford and then to Athens has been taken off the road.

10/17- At a meeting of the directors of the Rib Lake Lumber Co. held recently, Frank Handeyside was elected General Manager to succeed F.W. Warrington, who resigned that position because of his health. Mr. Handeyside arrived in Rib Lake in October to take over the new position.
